STORIES TO REJOICE



Playful child Aliya (name changed), is 2 years old and daughter of Razakbhai Vohra from Anand district. In June '22, she had complain of fever with skin rashes but no treatment was taken, and the problem got relieved on its own. After that she had history of fall down which injured her right shoulder. She was not able to raise/move her hand. Due to paleness and weakness of the body, in July again she got admitted to the hospital where has detailed investigations were carried out. She was given injection of vitamin B12 and 1 unit of PCV was transfused.

In her blood reports, the doctor suspected some blood disorders and decrease in count of platelets. Bone marrow biopsy was suggested to the parents which was done in August.

She was diagnosed with Pre B cell Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia (ALL) cancer (Blood Cancer) in treatments of six months chemotherapy and IVIG were administered at different stages, under the guidance of the Hematologist of the Hospital. Bone marrow procedure was carried out after some time of this treatment. And now, she is doing well and is under maintenance treatment for next 1.5 year. The family thanked the team of doctors, hospital and all donors for providing support.

18 years old, Vishalkumar Arvindbhai Sindha is from Dhuvaran village of Anand district. During his apprentice training, an iron nail accidentally thrusted in his leg at Dhuvaran ITI. Unfortunately As he was not treated on time, as a consequence his mouth started closing from the second day. His parents took him to a local hospital in Dhuvaran for treatment. There the doctor told that he has caught Tetanus. He was refereed to Shree Krishna Hospital, Karamsad on worsening of the situation.

When Vishalkumar was admitted to our hospital, he was having frequent convulsions, so he was immediately put on ventilator support, iron, antibiotics, and muscle release drugs. He was discharged after 35 days of medical treatment under the constant care of experts.

But as his socioeconomic situation was not that good, his parents were worried about the cost of treatment. It was taken care by the Mandal's esteemed donors. Vishalkumar and his family thanked all the donors who supported his treatment, he got discharged and went home with a smile on his face. The parents thanked everyone including the donors.



Vijaybhai Parmar

33-year-old Vijaybhai Chhotabhai Parmar hails from Vadtal village, Anand district. He supports his family by doing painting work. One day while returning home from work he met with a serious road accident. He was brought to the Trauma and Emergency Centre of Shree Krishna Hospital and was immediately posted for a CT scan. He was diagnosd with severe brain hemorrhage and his skull was fractured which further damaged his sensory and motor faculties

A craniotomy and neurosurgery were immediately performed on him, after which he was admitted to the ICU with a ventilator. His wife took care of the initial cost of treatment after that requested the Mandal for help. After assessing their socio economic condition,

financial assistance was provided with the help of donors. After 31 days of intensive treatment, Vijaybhai was discharged under home care. The family received support to manage their livelihood and expressed their gratitude to all the supporters and doctors.

- The Gynecology Department gave a new lease of life to a 50-year-old & 34 -year-old women, by removing their ovarian cysts, which weighed over 3 kgs.
- A 19-year-old boy who tried to attempt suicide by inhaling two tablets of celphos (pesticide) was successfully treated with the help of ECMO therapy at Critical Care Centre. This was one of its kind of clinically challenging case where the patient's life was saved despite very slim chances of survival. The collective efforts and expertise of the Doctors of our Critical Care are responsible for this achievement.
- NICU doctors performed a peritoneal dialysis on the newborn and saved her life, born with difficulty in breathing, suffering from pneumonia, kidney severely injured and had not been passing urine since birth.
- Shantaben Suryakantbhai Desai (Vaso) Diagnostic Centre received a renewed accreditation from the National Accreditation Board for Testing and Calibration Laboratories (NABL) under 'Medical Laboratories - Requirements for Quality and Competence.
